Recreation Activities Report

January 22, 2020 – February 18, 2020

Scott's Flat Campground

Projects in Progress or Completed:

- Tree work continues at the properties on Scotts Flat and Casci Roads
- Winter cleanup continues throughout all the campgrounds
- Prep work has begun with NID's Human Recourses Department and Blue Ribbon Temporary Agency for the 2020 temporary hiring
- Recreation maintenance staff installed a permanent floating buoy on a shallow rock near the spillway. The buoy is drilled into the rock so it can no longer float away or be taken away
- Staff met with Biffs Fishin' Mission about their yearly campout April 30th May 4th. This will be their 35th year with the District
- BONC (Bicyclist of Nevada County) had a trail maintenance day on February 8th
- Staff has been working with an Accounting Consultant, Jeff Bixby, both Accounting and Recreation have been able to make several positive changes to how we record and reconcile Recreation revenue

Future Projects:

- Tree work in Gate 2 prior to the start of the season
- Order fire rings
- Painting all the showers
- Continue work on the interior of the Ditch Tenders House

Orchard Springs Campground

Projects in Progress or Completed:

- Completed 10 11 acres of masticating work to the right of the campground entry and behind our camp host house; it looks beautiful
- Staff has been working on cleaning up the beach area. This is a problem area every year with the collection of logs and debris

Future Projects:

- Order picnic tables and umbrellas for the store picnic area
- Install a shade structure over the picnic and play area

Long Ravine Campground

Projects in Progress or Completed:

- Water system replacement is still moving forward
- Ordered the balance of the boat slips to replace the old wooden slips
- Recreation staff has been dismantling the old slips in preparation to remove them from the water. NID's maintenance crew will help to remove the slips from the water, February 19th
- PG&E has created a large amount of debris with their tree work, NID's Environmental Resources Administrator, Neysa King, is working with them on a plan for cleanup
- Hired new camp hosts, husband-wife team, they start mid-March

Future Projects:

• Restripe the boat launch and overflow parking lots

Peninsula Campground

Projects in Progress or Completed:

- Peninsula is closed for the season effective September 12th
- Eight trees hazard trees were taken down by Jensen's Tree Care; they will also be doing work at Scotts Flat Gate 2

Future Projects:

- Having Best Sandblasting work on the showers
- Upgrading the inside of the bathrooms, new paint, flooring, and bathroom fixtures
- Creating a day-use/swim area

Upper Division, Jackson Meadows Campground

Projects in Progress or Completed:

- Jackson Meadows is closed for the winter season
- With the lack of snow, staff has started planning for an early opening
- Staff has been working with the USFS on updating their websites for campgrounds that are in our Special Use Permit; the group prices hadn't been updated since 2014/15

Future Projects:

- Tree work at Sawmill dispersed sites
- Replacing all the campground barriers, this will help with unauthorized parking and crowding within the campgrounds
- Ensuring there are three camp hosts for the 2020 season

Combie Reservoir

Projects in Progress or Completed:

- All is quiet out at Combie during the winter
- Staff has been working with NID's Encroachment Department, Maryann Bailey, to finish the dock encroachment rules and regulations and dock specs; going to APC in March

Future Projects:

• Determine and start the clean-up process for all the non-authorized encroachments on Combie and our other reservoirs

Greenhorn Campground

Projects in Progress or Completed:

- Spoke to Mike Liserra (NID's concessionaire) he and his staff have been working on winter cleanup in preparation for the 2020 season
- For 2020, the Liserra's raised their reservation fee from \$5.00 to \$10.00

Future Projects:

- Continue to help the Liserra's when necessary and feasible. It's nice to work as a team
- Install our Quagga Mussel sign for self-inspection and get Greenhorn staff implementing and supporting our self-inspection program
