We are writing to request an item be added to the NID Board meeting agenda for the upcoming meeting to discuss the Scotts Flat Lake regulations.

Specifically, we are requesting that the NID Board consider extending the current quiet hours (10 PM - 8 AM) regulation imposed on the campgrounds to the lake itself. Lake quiet hours are typically enforced by limiting the boat speeds to 5 mph (flat wake).

The benefits to the community include:

- A truly quiet time for campgrounds and nearby homes when the boat engine noise does not dominate the lake soundscape prior to 8:00 AM.
- Safe recreation and exercise time for the many swimmers, paddle boards, rowers, fishermen and kayakers who enjoy Scotts Flat Lake.
- Reduced early morning congestion on the docks, which also supports Nevada County's Health & Human Services Guidance for the Community regarding social distancing.
