

## Vegetation Management around Magnolia Road

In response to public input, we've just completed work to reduce the amount of vegetation around Magnolia Road near Lake of the Pines. The recent work was funded with a portion of our \$150,000 CAL FIRE California Forest Improvement Program (CFIP) grant.

Our watershed division is facilitating the vegetation management work, creating prioritized list to track treatment and long-term maintenance. Similar to the fire fuel reduction work being done around our campgrounds, a forester and experts identify hazard trees and underbrush to be removed. In total 18 acres were treated.

The treatment work has been completed, and planning is now underway to complete a fire fuelbreak to benefit residential homes within the wildland urban interface adjacent to the Bear River.

In general, beyond our routine maintenance work, to manage vegetation and fire risk we grant grazing leases on four of our properties – three in the lower elevation oak-grassland communities and one in the high elevation zone.
